In a tale as romantic and cinematic as it can get, Nitin Tailor was born and brought up near the banks of the Narmada river in Gujarat. From the spirituality and natural charm of the small town of Bharuch, Tailor eventually found his way into a multi-national company in Bangalore, earning a comfortable salary. With an educational stint in Sweden and entrepreneur of the year award at IIIT Bangalore, Tailor was always ambitious.

Once the charm of the big city faded, the call to return to his roots overwhelmed him. Determined to be a more positive influence in society, Tailor left his cushy job in Bangalore, and took the first train to Bharuch. Once there, he set up an NGO to address health and educational needs of the poor in Bharuch's rural areas, using the latest technology. Fuelled by the success and honesty of the work, Tailor went forward to strike into reality a social venture Serve Happiness Foundation. The aim of this foundation was to help the rural poor convalesce from their regressive socio-economic status by supporting grassroots communities and individuals hoping to bring social change. A runner up and winner in the Startup Weekend, Nasscom organised by IIM, Ahmedabad, Tailor got himself certified n Technology Entrepreneurship by Stanford University's Venture Lab. He also got an honor to become first TEDx speaker from his region. In 2014, Tailor was invited, for his efforts, to participate in The International Happiness Initiative Consortium announced by Dr T. Hamid Al-Bayati, former Ambassador of Iraq to the United Nations, to celebrate the International Day of Happiness (UN) on March 20, 2014.

The only motivation that keeps Tailor pumping and jumping for the poor, underprivileged and rural is the need to inspire the youth in more nation-building activities that aren't simply directed at India's small ultra-urban strata of society. He facilitated the inspirational Jagriti Yatra and Yuva Prerna Yatra for the youth. These journeys were to mark him profoundly. Deeply inspired, and to pay tribute to his motherland Narmada, Nitin decided to organise the Narmada Prerna Yatra. It would be the greatest opportunities to meet the real heroes who've created entrepreneurial success stories in the region. In a sense, this story of Bharuch-Narmada is an amazing return to the medieval and ancient times when Bharuch developed into an important trading port for Arabs. A bustling cultural and economic hub, it only makes sense that Tailor returns this entrepreneurial spirit back to the rural areas of Bharuch.

Narmada Prerna Yatra - an initiative of Serve Happiness Foundation, Bharuch – envisions to inspire the youth of the country to contribute for the welfare of the society. From a divine thought "Narmada Prerna Yatra" has taken the formation and has successfully completed 5 different editions having more than 100 rural and urban youth across 15 different states of India. This year it was organized from 29<sup>th</sup> sept to 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct 2016 and comprised of 17 youths (called as Changemakers) from states such as Rajasthan, Uttrakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand Gujarat and Maharashtra.

#### INAUGURATION AND FLAG OFF CEREMONY





The inaugural ceremony, held at the Vishwa Gayatri Brahmpeeth 'Alakhdham',, Zadeshwar, Bharuch, on the banks of the Narmada, was presided over by the Chief Guest Mr. Nirmalsinh Yadav (Director, Green Agro Service Pvt Ltd.), emphasized the importance of agriculture in our nation and opportunities available in agriculture field. The ceremony culminated with arti of Maa Narmada — after which with the blessings of Maa Narmada all the participants proceeded to begin this unique journey of awakening by first meeting role models outside and then imbibing it within themselves! Post this, the next 4 days were spent meeting with various grass-root level heroes who have sacrificed their rewarding careers to dedicated their lives solely to effect a positive and everlasting change in the society.

## **VISIT TO SARDAR NAGAR SCHOOL, VALIA (EDUCATION)**







"Welcome To Sardar Nagar School" that's how smiling and cheerful faces of students with puppets has heartily welcomed all the yatris at their beautiful school campus located in small tribal village Valia near Bharuch. Sardar Nagar School is a government primary school but hard efforts of our role model Mr. Kamleshbhai Kosamia, School Principal and teacher Mrs. Meenakshiben has made this school a benchmark for which even the best private school will feel shy in competing with in term of quality and content richness, pedagogy and process of linking learning, loving and living. Mr. Kamleshbhai studied various ways in which students can be taught not just the formal subjects but also about nature and social responsibility, and a spirit of sharing one's knowledge with others. In eleven years, he has transformed the school. Almost every wall, floor and step in the school is a learning lab. Children do not often get a chance to see the historical artifacts which are no more in use. He has built a small museum of floor grinding mill of stone, bullock cart, churner, traditional huts, designed old scooter with alphabets, book cupboard from old fridge etc. Every child is greeted on his/her birthday. Luckily on the same day together with students we all have celebrated birthday of Mr.Kamleshbhai. It was even more striking to note that students are provided much personal care by teachers to ensure their attendance is full in classes. And we could witness the love and respect of students for Kamleshbhai and teachers.

Teachers do profiling of students at the time of admission and the file is passed on as the child progresses along with mention of all the developmental needs, socio-economic and family background. Concepts of peer learning, learning with nature, and use of technology in imparting education has been very well adopted in the school. When teachers like Kamleshbhai and Meenakshiben go out of the way to make their school so interesting and engrossing, it is not surprising that children don't want to go to home. All yatris were astounded to see when one student Ravi explained his social innovation project about sanitation which he has represented recently at IIM Ahmedabad.

#### VISIT TO VIVEKANAND GRAMIN TEKNIKI KENDRA, GUMANDEV (EDUCATION)



After having delicious lunch we headed towards our next visit which was Vivekananda Gramin Tekniki Kendra is another branch of SEWA Rural with a vocational training centre started in 1987 that offers training to about 200 underprivileged youths every year. Mr. R K Patel has given brief about the organization and made us visit the beautiful lush green campus. The various trades offered at the VGTK campus include turner, fitter, welder, electrician,

environment operator machinist, computer hardware technician, nursing assistant, etc. Ten months of theoretical and in-campus practical training is followed by first-hand exposure and experience of 2 months in nearby Ankleshwar and Bharuch industries, after which all the students are placed on jobs. The institute also ensures follow-up of all the students placed in industries for one year to monitor their performance, attendance and if any dropout happens then counseling is done by the institute to re-instate the employment of youth. This has yielded 100% job placements of students in the industries and thus has helped in socio-economic upliftment of the tribal people.

#### VISIT TO HEALTH TRAINING AND RESOURCE CENTER, GUMANDEV (EDUCATION)





On the second day, we started our journey by visiting the ancient Lord Hanuman Temple at Gumandev. After hearing the history of this temple and seeking the blessings of lord hanuman we all headed towards Health Training And Resource Centre where Mrs. Gayatri ben has guided us and provide detail information about this center. Different cadres of health workers from voluntary organizations, government staff and students from varied academic institutions from India and abroad have expressed keen interest to visit SEWA Rural and learn from its rich grass root level experiences in community health, comprehensive eye care and rural development. To meet such ever-increasing demands, a formal a training centre was established in 1990 with modern facilities for which financial assistance was provided by the US-based Share & Care Foundation. Every year, more than 80 varied organizations and 1000 trainees benefit from this. Various workshops are also organised for the staff of SEWA Rural so as to enhance as well as reaffirm their competence, knowledge and involvement.

On 18th February 2010, a newly constructed Health Training and Resource Centre was inaugurated with aid from Helping the MacArther Foundation and Govt. of India. The training centre is the first NGO facility to be recognized by UNICEF and Government of India for training in IMNCI (Integrated Management of Neonatal and Childhood Illnesses) which provides various kind of in house training on prenatal care, safe deliveries at home, timely risk identification, referral procedures, treatment of minor ailments, record-keeping, and newborn care and also provide training and orientation to outside participants which includes Traditional Birth Attendants, Community Health Volunteers, Paramedic and Multipurpose Health Workers and Supervisors, Project Managers, Medical Interns, Residents, Government Health Officials and students from faculty of medicine, social work, rural studies and health management.

#### VISIT TO SHARDA MAHILA VIKAS SOCIETY, JHAGADIA (WOMEN EMPOWERMENT)



After spending great time in beautiful lush green campus of VGTK, Gumandev we have arrived our next destination at Jhagadia where SEWA Rural main campus was located. With the initiative of SEWA Rural a new organization, Sharada Mahila Vikas Society, is formed in 2003, to facilitate the development, empowerment and well being of women by their active participation and to make entire setup conducive to the women. For improvement of economical, social and educational condition of poor women, various educational, awareness generation as well as economic

activities are undertaken. Emphasis is also given to aspects of self development, gender discrimination, empowerment, social security and awareness building.

Preference is given to socio economically poor women for benefiting from various income generating activities. About 200 such women are engaged in papad, nasta and garment making. Production and sale is worth of about 70 lacs per year of papads – nasta and garments. Wage earning by the beneficiary women is to the tune of 25 lacs every year. More than 500 women have become member of Saving and Credit Scheme which promotes the habit of saving and having access to loans at very low interest. Efforts are also made to sensitise about 150 adolescent girls towards sensitive issues related to reproductive health so as to ensure responsive behaviour from them. About 250 primary school going children belonging to poor section of society are provided special coaching on daily basis. With their foundation becoming stronger, the dropout rate among their schooling has been reduced and emphasis is put on overall development and to be responsible citizens.

### VISIT TO SEWA RURAL, JHAGADIA (COMMUNITY HEALTH)



SEWA Rural offers an extensive hospital service at Kastruba Hospital. The 100-beds facility offers round-the-clock emergency services, special care for women, children and people with eye diseases, and separate clinics for Tuberculosis, Diabetes & infertility. These services are strongly supported by a well-equipped modern laboratory, X-ray and ultra-sonography units along with operation theatres and appropriate blood storage facility. Medicines are available in the hospital campus at a low cost without compromising on the quality. Every year about 70,000 out-

patients & 12,000 in-patients are treated; about 2,200 deliveries & 7,000 operations are carried out. About 35% of the out-patients and 75% of Indoor patients are treated free. Their comprehensive eye programme encompasses all components of eye care – prevention, promotion and rehabilitation. Under this programme, Jhagadia and Valia blocks were made cataract free as per WHO guidelines.

A large number of social factors do not allow the vast majority to access the hospital facilities. This prompted SEWA Rural to commence a project of Healthcare at Doorsteps in 1982, initially for 10 villages. Later, it was expanded to cover 40 villages, and the government-entrusted Jhagadia PHC (Primary Health Centre) was managed for more than 10 years. Such innovative public-private partnership model in healthcare was experimented for the first time in the country.

#### I AM TECHO PROJECT

ImTeCHO stands for "Innovative mobile-phone Technology for Community Health Operations". ImTeCHO project leverages upon 30 years of grass-root experience and community-based safe motherhood and child survival platform created by voluntary organization SEWA Rural. ImTeCHO is an innovative mobile phone application to improve performance of ASHAs through better supervision, support and motivation for increasing coverage of proven maternal, newborn and child health interventions among resource-poor settings in India.

#### VISIT TO NARMADA DAIRY FARM, RAJPARA (DAIRY FARMING)









Our next role model visit was Mr.Narpatsinh Nioria ( awarded as best farmer of Gujarat ) and his son Mr. Kishoresinh Nioria who is truly an inspiration for all of us and gave us more insights of dairy farming who owns biggest dairy farm of Narmada district in small beautiful village Rajpara located at the bank of river Narmada. Started with one cow and initial investment of 1.5 lakh, today the Narmada Dairy Farm has about 100 numerous cows and buffaloes which produces about 300 liter milk every day. Kishorebhai has also shown the milk machine with the capacity to perform work of 25 labourers which is also used when labourers are not available. He also explained about the modern technique like artificial insemination practiced at their farm. Their Dairy farm's main focus activities are – milk production, composting and value added products. They also use cow dung as organic fertilizers for their farming.

#### VISIT TO SARDAR SAROVAR DAM, KEVADIA (ENGINEERING)





The third day beginning of the Narmada Prerna Yatra was a rich experience between nature with first visit to Sardar Sarovar Dam at the Narmada River. The Sardar Sarovar Dam is a gravity dam on the Narmada River near Navagam, Gujarat. It is the largest dam and part of the Narmada Valley Project, a large hydraulic engineering project involving the construction of a series of large irrigation and hydroelectric multi-purpose dams on the Narmada River. The project took form in 1979 as part of a development scheme to increase irrigation and produce hydroelectricity. It was a unique experience for all Yatri's to experience technological advancement in midst of nature, river and valley. The magnitude of the dam inspired the engineer Yatri's to learn how a project can be well established for fulfilling cause for human development and meeting requirements such as irrigation, electricity generation, supply of water for domestic and industrial usage etc. Today the dam is well known as the "life line of Gujarat". Yatris also got change to see the under construction site of *Statue of Unity* which is going to be the world's tallest statue. This monument, dedicated to Sardar Patel, is 182m tall and is being built near the Sardar Sarovar dam.

### **VISIT TO ISHAN ORGANIC, GARUDESHWAR (AGRICULTURE)**





"Being in the company of nature is fantastic" this is what our next role model believes. Vivaswan Bhatt an agripreneur based in Garudeshwar left his lucrative career in South Africa and returned to his mother land Narmada and started organic farming. We have visited his beautiful Ishan Organic farm where he grows different crops, vegetables and fruits using organic farming. He gave us valuable knowledge about organic farming and explained importance of organic farming for living healthy lifestyle. Vivaswan along with his wife Kruti has also developed different organic food products like Turmeric Powder, Chyawanpras, Pickles. All yatris were truly energized with the fresh and positive environment at this farm and enriched with the knowledge of organic farming.

#### VISIT TO PRINCE MANVENDRA SINGH GOHIL, RAJPIPLA (HUMANITY)





"Welcome all , I am Manvender Singh Gohil" soberly welcomed the prince of the former princely state of Rajpipla along with his friends in his beautiful Rajvant Palace located at the bank of river Karjan in Rajpipla. Manvender Singh Gohil is the direct descendent of the 650 year old Gohil Dynasty. Modest composure, polite tone, swift walk and a friendly aura, the prince donned a smile with a complimenting kurta. His work for freedom of gay rights is highly regarded worldwide. A motivation himself, he symbolises the right to equality. Popularly known as the 'gay prince of India', his presence encourages you to believe in yourself enunciating the meaning of courage. The Prince of Rajpipla in Gujarat, who had whipped up a storm of dissent for himself by coming out in the open about his gay status in 2006, has been working to spread awareness about AIDS in these communities through his Lakshya Trust established in 2000. He is currently the Goodwill Ambassador of AIDS Healthcare Foundation India Cares (AHF). Recipient of so many accolades across the world he is the only Indian who has been appeared in world renowned show "The Oprah Winfrey Show" thrice. He has explained about various activities they do for the transgender community welfare and AIDS prevention.

#### VISIT TO PRINCE INDRAVIKRAM SINGH GOHIL, RAJPIPLA (HERITAGE TOURISM)









It was an honor to meet Prince Indra Vikram Singh Gohil is prince of the erstwhile royal house of Rajpipla, Grandson of Maharaja Vijaysinghji Gohil and descendant of the ancient Gohil Rajput dynasty. He is an entrepreneur, well known writer, publisher and heritage resort promoter. He has authored nine books, eight of them on the game of cricket, and one entitled 'A Maharaja's Turf' on the triumph of his grandfather Maharaja Vijaysinhji in the Epsom Derby of 1934. Now he is in the process of setting up a heritage resort in Rajpipla. He has narrated history of princely state of Rajpipla and also discussed about the opportunities available in heritage tourism in India.

We all were truly overwhelmed and honored to visit the final symbol of the 600-year rule of the Gohil dynasty over Rajpipla State, the magnificent Vadia Palace which was built between 1934 and 1942 by Maharana Sir Vijaysinhji, the last ruling Maharaja of Rajpipla and set in a 151-acre estate with well laid out gardens, and mango and lime orchards. The pristine white two-storeyed monument – also known as Indrajit-Padmini Mahal – was often referred to as the 'Taj Of Gujarat'. The building and its outhouses cover almost an acre – 4320 square yards. It was financed by Maharaja Vijaysinhji's winnings at the Epsom Derby, 1934, in which his horse Windsor Lad finished first. The palace was designed by Mr. Burjor Sohrab J. Aga of M/s Shapoorjee N. Chandabhoy & Company in a predominantly Indo-Saracenic style with a few western features, and cost around Rupees four million to build.

Vadia Palace is indeed an architectural marvel that houses many delightful features, and an enchanting heritage of princely India.

#### **VISIT TO BANANA WAFER BUSINESS, BHADAM (AGRIBUSINESS)**







Next we have visited to the banana wafer business located in Bhadam village near Rajpipla. Business owner Geeta Ben and his son Dhaval narrated the tales of the augmentation of the enterprise with the help of local communities and resources. Banana is the second largest popular fruit in India after Mango and Bharuch and Narmada regions are the major banana producing centers. It's a growing business with a very low investment and high profit in this region. Around 250 kg wafers are produced every day. They have also started another big unit in nearby village Segwa which has capacity to produce 1000kg wafers per day.

This enterprise was started with an initial investment of around 2.5 lakh which include machine cost, boiler and a slicer. They provide employment to the rural women of the nearby villages. The wafers are transported in all the regions of Gujarat including Ahemdabad, Bharuch, Vadodra etc. Geeta Ben being a mentor of the localities believes in co-operation rather than in competition. The wafers were displayed at the road side of the highway with an open invitation to speeding tourist vehicles. Whilst Geeta Ben juggled between the selling department and the manufacturing unit, the yatris munched on the irresistible fried snacks.

The valedictory ceremony of the four days Narmada Prerna Yatra held on 2<sup>nd</sup> Oct 2016 at the Rajvant Palace of Rajpipla in the gracious presence of Prince Manvedra Singhji and Prince Indra Vikram Singhji, Duke De Andre Richardson and Mr. Vivaswan Bhatt. All the yatris have been given certificate of successfully completion of the Yatra. After having lunch at Rajvant Palace Yatra has ended at the same place Vishwa Gayatri Brahmpeeth at the bank of mother Narmada from where it began. 


